Third Street Light Rail:

The LRV's will begin weekend service on Saturday, January 13th, 2007. While this will be a great asset for residents who use public transportation, those of you who drive or walk in the Third street corridor need to be careful. These vehicles are essentially trains, they are very heavy and they glide to a stop. This means that if you drive or walk into the path of an LRV, the driver can't stop very quickly. Please be careful and avoid being injured in an accident. Also, as I mentioned in previous emails, the police department will be enforcing the posted signs related to the operation of the LRV system. Please take some time to adjust to the LRV operation, be safe and avoid a citation or injury.

Robbery Abatement

In response to recent robberies in the district, we periodically conduct decoy operations using a police officer that poses as a vulnerable law-abiding citizen. Often times the members of Bayview Station put themselves at risk in order to capture these suspects. The incident listed below is one of those decoy operations.

Monday, January 15, 2007 - 10:30 PM - Robbery, Arrest Made - 1600 block of Kirkwood Avenue - CS# 070 057 520 - Plainclothes officers conducting an operation to capture robbery suspects captured a violent probationer just before he was able to strike the decoy officer with a car fender. The decoy officer was walking down the 1600 block of Kirkwood Avenue when the suspect approached him and said, "Give me what you got." The decoy officer said he was "broke" and continued on his walk. The suspect ran in front of the victim, blocked his path, and now armed with the car fender he repeated his demand. The decoy officer began to run away and the officers assigned to "cover" him moved in.

Officer Scott was the first to reach the suspect and was forced to tackle him. With the aid of the decoy officer the suspect was brought into custody.

The man, a resident of Livermore, on probation in San Francisco, was booked for attempted robbery, and assault charges.

Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Monday, January 15, 2007 - 2:00 AM - Assault with a Gun - 600 block of Cesar Chavez - CS# 070 050 916 - Bayview Officers responded to a nightclub on the 600 block of Cesar Chavez Street on a report of shots fired. Arriving units were unable to find anyone that was shot or anyone willing to give a statement. Empty shell casings were found outside the club. A few minutes later a young man went to SFGH emergency room. Police responded and questioned him. He told the police that he was standing outside the club when someone started to fire a gun. He dove to the ground. When the shooting was over he got up, dusted himself off and drove home. While he was driving he felt a burning sensation in his chest and realized he was wounded. Fortunately, the bullet only grazed him. Police do not have any leads at this time.

Monday, January 15, 2007 - 2:46 AM - Evading a Police Vehicle - Newhall Street and Newcomb Avenue - CS# 070 050 875 - Officers Singh and Kobold were on patrol in this drug plagued area when they saw a car stopped in the middle of the block with people congregated around it. As they drove closer they heard someone yell out a warning that the police were near. The car then sped off. Officers Kobold and Singh followed the car and a small chase ensued. The brief chase ended when the driver turned down a

dead end street. The driver and passenger did not give up yet and abandoned the car and run away. The suspects ran through the mini park on Palou Avenue and Phelps Street and hid in an alcove of a house on Palou Avenue where they were brought into custody. The car was registered in Marin County and may have been an unreported stolen vehicle, but the owner could not be located. The two young men were cited for traffic violations and resisting arrest.

Tuesday, January 16, 2007 - 7:47 PM - Stolen Auto - Double Rock Housing Projects - CS# 070 057 172 - A twelve year old and a thirteen year old were arrested for possession of a stolen auto this evening. Bayview Officers Norris and Whitfield were responding to the Double Rock Housing Project on a report of juveniles vandalizing a car. When they arrived they found the juveniles who then started to run. They gave up quickly and were taken to the station. At the station, two of the juveniles admitted to stealing the car earlier in the day. Because of their age, they were cited from the station.

Wednesday, January 17, 2007 - 5:00 PM - Parole Violation - Harbor Road - CS# 070 060 852 - A Big Block gang member was returned to State Prison today after a parole search was conducted of his home by the subject's parole officer and Bayview Plainclothes Officers. In his room were narcotics and numerous photographs and drawings depicting gang activities. Because association with a gang is a violation of parole, he will be returning to prison.

Thursday, January 18, 2007 - 2:50 PM - Attempted Homicide - Hare Street and Middle Point Roads - CS# 070 064 622 - A young man recently released from jail was shot in the leg after exiting a vehicle on Hare Road. The victim told officers that after he got out of a parked car he heard a loud gun shot and then felt his leg buckle out from underneath him. He fell to the ground and took cover. An anonymous caller called the station and told the police that she saw a group of men at the dead end of Harbor Road with a rifle that had a scope on it. Harbor Road is considered Big Block gang territory and Westpoint and Hare Streets is considered Westmob gang territory. The evidence suggests that the suspect fired a high-powered rifle from Harbor Road across a ravine to Hare Streets striking the victim. The victim survived this attack.

Friday, January 19, 2007 - 10:00 AM - Carjacking, Kidnapping - 3rd and Jamestown - CS# 070 070 124 - A young man was car jacked on 3rd Street and Jamestown Avenue. As he was waiting for the light to change a man opened the passenger door of his car and got in. The suspect jabbed an object in the rib cage of a male and told the victim to drive. The suspect had the victim drive to a marina in Brisbane and forced the victim out of the car.
