

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE June 16, 2005

Missed E-Mail

Yesterday morning, one of our officers was injured attempting to make an arrest and had to be hospitalized. I spent much of the morning at SFGH and never quite caught up, thus, no e-mail went out yesterday. Today's e-mail includes reports from both June 14 and June 15.

Late Night Basketball

Last night was the final night for the regular season of this session of Late Night Basketball. The playoffs start next week and will continue for the following two weeks, culminating with the championship game on July 13. John Smith of Sunset Scavenger was the speaker in the pre-game workshop, and he gave an inspirational talk to the young men. John grew up on Hunter's Point Hill in public housing and was one of the first African American men hired by Sunset Scavenger in the 1970's. John shared his own story of the difficulties he faced growing up in the neighborhood, but his overall message of hope and persistence was very inspirational. Many thanks to both John and Sunset Scavenger for their ongoing support of this community, and of the SFPD and its efforts to make a difference.

Isaac's Bat Retired

For more than thirty years, the various police stations of the San Francisco Police Department have competed against each other in a softball league. Since most of the participating officers are younger and work nights, these games take place on Tuesday and Thursday mornings on ball fields across the city. Bayview's home field is Jackson Park at the base of Potrero Hill. This afternoon, Bayview Station defeated Mission Station for the "A" league softball championship, and following the game, we retired the softball bat of Isaac Espinoza. As many of you remember, Isaac was the young Bayview officer who was gunned down on Newhall Street last April, and since his death, the members of Bayview's team have used Isaac's favorite bat for all of the games. This is the same bat that Deputy Chief Greg Suhr and I carried up Mount Kilimanjaro in January, where we hit a softball from the peak of the mountain in Isaac's memory. Now that we have brought the championship home to Isaac's team, we are officially retiring his bat, and will be presenting it to Isaac's widow so that she can display it in the "49er room" that Isaac had planned for their home prior to his death. Congratulations to all of Bayview's officers on their championship.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Violence

June 14, 1:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded on a shots fired call and

located several spent casings, as well as at least one spent slug. Witnesses at the scene heard six or seven gunshots, but no suspects or victims were described or located (050 664 167).

June 14, 9:47 p.m., a woman reported that bullets had been fired into her home on the first block of Kiska Road. No suspects were seen (050 665 955). A second person reported that his vehicle, which had been parked on Kiska, was shot at also (050 662 456).

June 15, 1:30 a.m., two people reported to Bayview officers that they had parked their car in front of the liquor store at 3rd and LaSalle and were approached by two men who stole their car at gunpoint. Suspect one is a black male, 19-20, 6'1", 150, dreadlock hair, gold teeth, wearing a black sweatshirt and black jeans. Suspect two is a black male, 6'3", 150, wearing a black sweatshirt and black jeans (050 666 339).

June 15, 10:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded on a shooting call at 86 Westpoint and located a man who stated that he had been shot. The man reported that he dove into some bushes after he heard what he thought were gunshots. The man had a small scratch on his leg and medical assistance was summoned. The paramedics determined that the man had possibly scratched his leg while diving into the bushes. Witnesses at the scene could provide no further information (050 670 142).

Drug Cases

June 15, 8:47 p.m., Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol at Oakdale and Baldwin when they saw a well known local man, who is suspected in several district shootings, loitering in the area. The officers arrested the man as a trespasser (he does not live in the development) and found that he was in possession of both a pair of binoculars and a pair of walkie talkies (both items are used by drug dealers in an effort to thwart police activities). The man, living in Daly City, was booked for trespassing and drug loitering (050 669 963).

The officer was treated for a variety of injuries and released from the hospital. The suspect, living in Richmond, was also treated and released, and was then booked for violation of parole, stolen auto, conspiracy, possession of a dagger, and possession of burglar tools (050 666 969).

June 15, 1:25 p.m., Bayview officers received information from a parole agent that a suspect wanted for domestic violence was working at a barber shop on 3rd Street, and the officers located the man, living on Dakota, and booked him for domestic violence, vandalism, and violation of parole (050

667 058).

June 15, 5:12 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers responded to 14 Crane on an auto burglary call and saw a suspect who matched the description provided walking away from the scene. The officers attempted to detain the suspect, but she resisted violently and called the officers several very unflattering names. The woman was eventually brought under control and booked for being under the influence of drugs in a public place (050 669 383). A different set of officers also responded and saw several potential suspects fleeing from the area, including one with blood on his hands. This suspect was detained and eventually identified by the caller as the man who had just burglarized a parked auto. The suspect, living in Oakland, was booked for auto burglary, vandalism, and possession of burglar tools (050 669 305).
