Crime and Enforcement Update

Warrant Arrest, 695 23rd Street, July 19, 5:36 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lavin and Damonte were on patrol when they found a man sleeping in a van. The officers knocked on the van's window and then saw the man (wearing slippers and pajamas!) running away from the back of the vehicle. The officers stopped the man and asked him why he was running, and he stated that he didn't want to get a ticket. The man had six vehicles parked in the area and stated that they all belonged to him. Two of the vehicles were found to have registration problems and were towed. The man was cited for illegal lodging and numerous vehicle code violations. A second man was found sleeping in one of the vehicles and was arrested for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (050 803 973).

Burglary Arrest, 200 block of Nueva, July 19, 11:09 a.m.

Bayview Officer Kwan responded on a burglary in progress call in which two men had just been seen prying open the front door of a home and then entering the home. Numerous officers responded to the scene and set up a "perimeter" in order to contain the suspects. Officers entered the property and the two suspects fled from the rear of the home. The officers pursued the suspects through six backyards on Gillette, and the suspects reversed course when they realized the area was cordoned off. The suspects ran into a different set of backyards and toward Lathrop, and one of the suspects was arrested. The second suspect continued fleeing, but was caught in Little Hollywood Park. Numerous pieces of property stolen from the house on Nueva were found in the rear yards that the suspects had run through. The first suspect, living on the 3200 block of San Bruno, was booked for burglary and for a warrant charging him with burglary. The second suspect, living in Oakland, was also booked for burglary. Each suspect had prior arrests for burglary, one as recent as May of 2005, and as the suspects were being booked, one of them laughed and said, "How does it feel to do all of that paperwork knowing we'll be out in a couple of hours?" They are apparently very familiar, and not very impressed with, our San Francisco criminal justice system (050 805 571).

Parole Violation, 5134 3rd Street, July 19, 3:17 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes officers responded on a call of drug dealing and located a man with an outstanding warrant charging him with violation of parole. The man, a transient, was booked for the warrant (050 806 767).

Warrant Arrest, 3rd and Revere, July 19, 3:25 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes officers were on patrol when they stopped to investigate a suspicious man in a parked vehicle and determined that the

man was wanted for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine. The man, living on Byxbee, was booked for the warrant (050 628 345).

Aggravated Assault, LaSalle and Osceola, July 19, 6:30 p.m.
Bayview Officers Rodatos and Sanders responded on a shots fired call and found a trail of blood which they followed to Oakdale and Lane, where they found a man with a gunshot wound. The officers summoned medical assistance and began to interview the victim. Numerous onlookers were present at the scene, including the victim's family members, and they told the victim, "Shut up and don't say nothing." The victim then stopped cooperating and was transported for medical treatment (050 807 624).

Battery, 1450 Hudson, July 19, 6:40 p.m.
Bayview Officers Coleman and Madrid responded on a battery call and spoke with a soccer referee who reported that he was refereeing a game when he gave one the players a "red card." The player became enraged and attacked the referee physically, and then threatened to "kick (his) a__." The suspect is a Hispanic male named Gilverto, 30-35, 5'8", 180, last seen wearing a soccer uniform (050 807 806).

Possession Cocaine, LaSalle and Ingalls, July 19, 9:45 p.m.
Bayview Officers Borgen and Wise responded on the call of a man taken into custody by private security. The security personnel had arrested a man found in possession of both crack cocaine and marijuana. The suspect, living on Osceola, was booked for possession of cocaine for sale and possession of marijuana (050 808 199).

Runaway Child Case, 1500 block of Oakdale, July 19, 10:42 p.m.
Bayview Officers Madrid and Coleman responded on a missing juvenile call and spoke with the female caller who reported that a 14 year old boy, who is a friend of her son, had come to her home and asked to spend the night. The woman became suspicious and determined that the boy was a runaway from a foster home. The officers took the boy into protective custody and notified Child Protective Services (050 758 011).

Warrant Arrest, Napoleon and Evans, July 19, 10:44 p.m.
Bayview Officer Cahill was on patrol when he came across a homeless encampment and found two persons sleeping in a tent, surrounded by large piles of debris and other property. The man was booked for illegal lodging and for a warrant charging him as a sex offender who had failed to register. The woman was cited for illegal lodging (050 808 177).
